Milo Cup Cricket – State Finals

Wyvern’s MILO Cup Cricket team travelled to Blacktown International Sport Centre on Monday to compete in the State Finals of the competition. After progressing through two earlier rounds of the competition, the boys were confident of matching it with the best school teams in the State.

Our first match was against eventual winners Quakers Hill Public School. In this match we got off to a solid start with Edson Whattam making quick runs. We didn’t consolidate on the good start from the top order, but managed to reach a fairly healthy score from the 8 overs. Our bowling attack was strong but the opponents scored the winning runs in the last over to win by 4 runs.

The second match was against the 2015 state champions SHORE. During this match, our batsmen failed to amass runs early with steady wickets falling. It wasn’t until Jack Earwaker and Bili Robertson came in that the runs started to accumulate. We finished with another solid total which turned out to be 3 runs short of what was required to challenge the strong SHORE side.

Our third and final pool match against Inaburra Public was a special match to win. Inaburra had defeated both Quakers Hill and SHORE in their early rounds. The opportunity was there for Wyvern to restore some pride and prove themselves worthy state finalists. From the outset Wyvern showed a level of intensity to totally dominate their more favoured rivals, winning by a mammoth margin. The fielding was a strong point with Owen Douglas and James McGregor especially displaying great catching.

Wyvern went into a playoff match for 5th and 6th against St Catherines School from Singleton. Here the boys showed what they are capable of once more, winning the match comfortably due to an all-round performance. Louis Bertrams was the entertainer switch hitting and ramping his way to runs, and a batting lesson from Felix Hochuli and Cody Rixom helped to amass a huge total. Mitchell Cope and James Andrew were economical bowlers helping to restrict the opponents.

This victory meant Wyvern Milo Cup cricket team finished a very commendable 5th in NSW. The cricket was fast, furious and highly enjoyable. Although the team did not play to their best during the early stage of the finals they were extremely competitive throughout the day. The standard of Wyverns play was positively remarked upon by NSW cricket staff in attendance. Well done boys!

Trinity Grammar Invitation Swimming Carnival

The Wyvern swim team competed at the Trinity Invitational Swimming Carnival last week hoping to finish off 2016 with a few more PB's. The carnival is an opportunity to compare your progress over the last 6 months against others from your school as well as rival schools. Lewis Saupin and Sebastian Parhash were up first in the individual medley events. Both swam solid races in 3rd and 4th respectively, providing a confident start to the program.

Newington's youngest competitors were at the carnival, with most representatives from the 8 years age group competing at an inter-school carnival for the first time. Adam Williams 2nd, Daniel Carter 6th, Felix Paskiewicz 4th and Patrick Jones 5th swam their hearts out in the 25m freestyle. Felix 2nd, Daniel 4th and Patrick 5th backed up this performance in the 25m breaststroke race. Adam Williams then finished with a super 4th in the backstroke, before the boys came together for a 4th place finish in the 4 x 25m relay event.

The 9 year age group started their freestyle with Sam Chittendon 2nd, Orlando Mina 2nd, Liam West 3rd and Joel Zipeure 3rd. Liam, Joel and Orlando then finished in the placings in every other event, breaststroke, backstroke and butterfly. The form was extremely consistent around this group so high expectations were held for the 4 x 50m freestyle relay. The boys proved their talent by winning the relay in a very quick time for the day.

The 10 year age group was spearheaded by Lewis Saupin, with a 2nd, 3rd or 4th in every A race including the junior 100m freestyle. Sam Hallit 5th, Jamie de Botton 6th and Toby Torrible 6th did well in the freestyle. Toby was 4th and Daniel Johnson was 2nd in the breaststroke event. Daniel 6th and Jamie 4th had fine swims in the backstroke, before Callan Rixom took 4th in the butterfly event. The 10 year relay

finished 4th with Saupin, Toby Torrible, de Botton and Hallit giving their best.

Matthew Torrible 2nd, Henry Isherwood 4th, Nicholas Venetoulis 3rd and Jaydan Stanton-Keir 5th began the 11 year old age group with tenacious swims. Henry 1st, Jaydan 2nd and Nicholas 4th highlighted the talent of this group in the breaststroke. Backstroke was no different, with Jaydan 3rd, Nicholas 5th and Sebastian Parhash 4th. Jaydan then represented the seniors in the 100m freestyle with 5th. A big strength of this age group is the butterfly discipline, Henry 3rd, Sebastian 1st and Jaydan 3rd once again highlighted this fact. The 11 Year 4 x 50m relay of Stanton-Keir, Venetoulis, Isherwood and Matthew Torrible finished with a commendable 3rd in a fast race.

Wyverns 12 year olds took to the water with Cody Rixom 5th, Luca Di Cristo 5th, Harrison Loeffler 3rd and Alexander Costa 5th in the freestyle. Alexander 2nd, Bili Robertson 7th and Cody 5th tried their best in the breaststroke event. Luca and Harrison represented in the backstroke with good swims, before Cody 5th and Harrison 4th showed great strength in the butterfly, after a slashing 4th in the senior 100m freestyle. It is clear to see that Harrison Loeffler has improved his swimming by lengths over the last few months with his fitness and strength obvious. This no doubt helped the 12 year relay of Loeffler, Costa, Di Cristo and Rixom finish in 4th place to round out the carnival.

The Wyvern team were consistently in the top 4 placing's all day, giving them some inspiration for next week's St Patricks Invitational, the last swimming carnival of the year.
