TEAM CAPTAINS - RUGBY AND FOOTBALL (SOCCER):

- Is always considerate of his team mates

The captain is not necessarily the team's most skillful player although demonstrating a high level of proficiency in the sport will be an asset. The coach reserves the right to withdraw the captaincy from a player at any stage of the season if their behaviour or attitude is not acceptable.

NSWCIS AFL

This week Lucas Dorrell has been competing for the CIS AFL team in the PSSA State Championships in Barooga.
