### Trinity Invitation Swimming Carnival

Term 4! A time of reports, of finishing the year off strong, of fun! And of course, Invitational Swimming Carnivals! Trinity College was the destination, and after battling traffic and nervousness we were there, ready to take on the best of the best in a two hour extravaganza.

Two of the stars of the future were first to splash things off with Jarrah Ronan scorching the pool in his 100m Individual medley. Jarrah had a typically packed meet and handled himself admirably, improving as the swim meet went on. His 100m Freestyle was particularly impressive with some brilliant turns and a fluent stroke, leading to a personal best time of 1:11.91 and a 3<sup>rd</sup> placing. Myles Parhash had an equally packed schedule and also improved as the meet went on, saving his best until last. Parhash had started strongly with a 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 200 Individual Medley and 50m Freestyle. He surprised even himself with his excellent backstroke swim, producing a personal best as he swam 34.37 seconds. If that wasn't impressive enough Myles then produced the anchor leg for the ages in the Freestyle relay as he matched it with one of the best in the country for his age group. A fantastic effort from a very talented swimmer!

The young brigade of Daniel Maxwell, Nicholas Venetoulis, Angus Rowe, Flynn Gannon, Tom Fraser and Anthony D'Adonna then showed their class as they dominated the podium with regular monotony. Young Maxwell was particularly impressive in the 25m Freestyle, as was Angus Rowe in the Backstroke. Without doubt, however, the highlight of the program was the 8 years 25m Freestyle relay!

The team of Venetoulis, Maxwell, Hooke and Rowe swam as though their lives depended on it, producing stunning times at each leg. Equal 2<sup>nd</sup> at the final change, young Angus Rowe stormed home to defeat the challenge from Trinity and win the event, to be met by a raucous cheer from the Newington faithful!

The 10 years saw the team of Jack Newton, Flynn Leung-Nicholson, Gaelen Dorigo and Fallon Fotaras take centre stage with some great results. Dorigo was a big improver from Term 1, swimming with great confidence. The softly

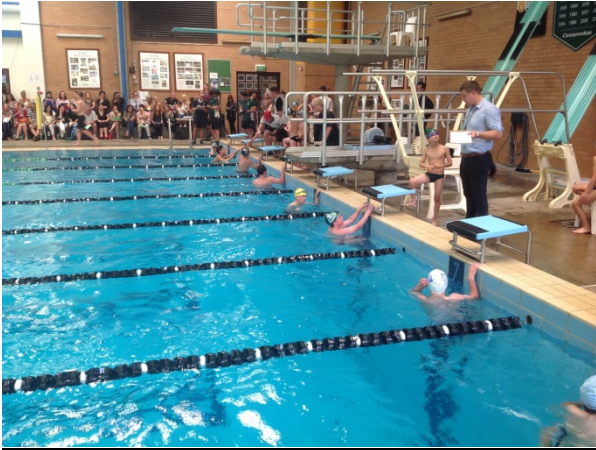
spoken Fotaras was also impressive in his Butterfly, finishing 3<sup>rd</sup>.

The 11's saw the likes of Marc Mardini, Sebastian Wyatt, Eden Horne, Sam (fully) Bencsik and Alexander Rumi enter the fray. Despite a rather nasty fall the day before, Horne performed strongly in a very strong age group. Wyatt was also strong, particularly in his pet event the Backstroke.

The Opens were the surprise packet of the meet with the swimmers involved stepping up against the toughest of oppositions. Louis Pidcock gave his all in every event he took part in, while Tom Ball was ruthless, particularly in the Breaststroke. Anthony Gestakovski was solid in his Butterfly and Kieran Corcoran swam a brilliant Backstroke race, finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> in his heat.

So after the dust (smoke) settled on this fantastic event, all eyes were on St Patricks'. The last time some of these young men would be swimming for either Lindfield or Wyvern, and a chance to leave their legacy for the young brigade to emulate.
