## UNDER 10's

The first round saw Newington's under 10's team play Sylvania Public School. The fast pace and evasive skills of our boys meant for a difficult

challenge for the opposition. Newington ran away with the game scoring an abundance of tries whilst keeping the developing Sylvania side scoreless. Bili Robertson and Rueben Palmer topping the try scorers list, with Sebastian Natoli amongst the points.

The next match against St Fiacres meant for a far harder assignment. During this match, the under 10's played some of their best rugby competing hard in the tackle and for the loose ball. Oliver Morahan, Cullen Visscher and Nicholas Venetoulis were relentless, with James McGregor and Yassin Safieh scoring brilliant tries to help Newington overcome St Fiacres 7 tries to 1.

Holy Family Menai were our 3rd round opponents. This game was a desperately close encounter, with neither side willing to give in. Despite some outstanding defence from Edson Whattam and Liam Carilline, Holy Family Menai just scraped home with a 3-2 scoreline.

For the last match on the under 10's schedule, the undefeated Our Lady of Fatima Caringbah stood in the way of progressing to the next round. During this match, Newington pride and sportsmanship rose up in an unblemished performance. The boys responded to the challenge, defending their line on countless occasions holding on for a 5 -3 victory. Thomas Oates and Flynn Gannon led the way during the match with mature performances.

The under 10's division was extremely competitive, with Newington qualifying for round 2 of the knockout along with 2 other schools all ending the day having accumulated the same points. The boys were tireless. They played with respect for the opposition and sportsmanship throughout the day. Above all, they played for the enjoyment of the game

#### **UNDER 12's**

In contrast to the fast start of the under 10's, the Newington 12's took time before their best rugby was apparent. The first match saw the under 12's take on Holy Family Menai. The boys tried hard but failed to unite as a team, playing in patches. We suffered an early defeat 2 - 1, but the close result was an indication of what the team was capable of if we played to our best. The youngest player on the team, Will Rumi proved his talent as the solo try scorer.

After a disappointing first game, the second match would display the attitude of the team, and indicate to the many Newington supporters the character of our boys. Playing for each other, the boys rallied to overrun their Our Lady of Fatima opponents 8 - 0. Sebastian Vardavas showed a Clean set of heals scoring 3 tries, with Zack McGeechan Max Langford, Curtis Palmer and Alex Cameron also contributing to the scoreline.

The team progressed to the semi-finals to meet another Our Lady of Fatima team finishing 2nd in their pool. With confidence restored, the boys realised that if they play with a focus on the moments during a game and not the outcome, quite often the result takes care of itself. The boys were clinical in the semi winning 4 -1 and progressing to the Grand Final. Sam Eagleton crossed the try line, Alex Rumi was in everything, Simon Latham gave impact, Atticus Bertrams was explosive and Henry Goodfellow was selfless in defence.

Caringbah North stood in the way of Newington making a great recovery from an early loss to take the day. This was an epic battle! The coach was extremely proud of the way the boys played. It was clear that they had improved their standard of play throughout the day. Even more pleasing was the attitude they displayed and the sportsmanlike qualities that we try to instil and uphold with Wyvern sport. Once again Sebastian Vardavas showed great pace to run in three tries. Ned Barnet-Hepples orchestrated the attack brilliantly with Newington holding on to win the GF 3 -2. But it was a moment just before fulltime that depicted the effort of this team. Curtis Palmer led the way all day, but in the dying seconds of the GF he produced an awesome try saving tackle with a determination befitting the result.

The 12's will join the 10's at the next stage of the competition, 27 May during Term 2.
