Newington Preparatory School Inter-House Swimming Carnival

Once again Wyvern students from Year 3-6 descended upon Ryde Aquatic Centre, to participate in the annual Inter-House Swimming Carnival. As in previous years the day promised to be a spectacle of aquatic prowess, participation and House spirit. The Lucas, Coates and Howe Houses were too keen to compete hard for the champion House title, with the mighty Williams House attempting to retain it. The day commenced with the finals of the butterfly, backstroke and 200m individual medley. These were followed by heats and finals of freestyle and breaststroke, with the relay events providing a perfect crescendo to the program.

In the Under 8 age group, 50m can seem like a long way to swim, but it was great to see the junior boys take on the challenge. Patrick Jones collected a 1st place ribbon in the 50m freestyle, with Daniel Carter 2nd and Felix Paszkiewicz 3rd. In the 25m breaststroke event Rome Caldwell 1st and Roman Radice 2nd battled it out to the cheers of the crowd.

The 9 year age division promised to be a hotly contested group with some promising young swimmers involved. In the 50m freestyle it was Joel Zipeure 1st, Liam West 2nd and Orlando Mina 3rd. The same 3 swimmers fought out the finish in the breaststroke and backstroke with Mina 1st, Zipeure 2nd and West 3rd in both events. In the butterfly event, Orlando Mina once again beat home West 2nd and Zipeure 3rd. But this swim was a special performance with Orlando Mina breaking the 9 years 50m butterfly record in a time of 47.74secs.

The 10 years age group saw Lewis Saupin deliver on the promise he displayed last year. Lewis was unchallenged winning every 10 year event as well as the Jnr 100m free and the Jnr individual medley. Daniel Johnson performed admirably in this division finishing 2nd in breaststroke, 3rd in butterfly and backstroke, 3rd in the Jnr 100m free and 2nd in the 200m individual medley. Mathew May swam a superb 2nd in the 50m freestyle, with Toby Torrible in 3rd. Toby backed up this performance with another 3rd in the 50m breaststroke. Callan Rixom 2nd in the butterfly and Jamie de Botton 2nd in the backstroke rounded out the placegetters in this division.

Perhaps the most competitive division was the 11 year old group. Regular swim team members Henry Isherwood, Nicholas Venetoulis and Jaydan Stanton-Keir dominated most strokes. The 50m freestyle was taken by Stanton-Keir followed by Venetoulis in 2nd and Isherwood in 3rd. Venetoulis claimed his favourite event breaststroke, with Stanton-Keir 2nd and Isherwood 3rd. Isherwood won the backstroke event once again followed by Venetouils 2nd and Stanton-Keir 3rd. The butterfly saw Stanton-Keir on top followed by Isherwood 2nd and Matthew Torrible 3rd. The potential of this group was evident with them winning all ribbons in the Snr events. It was Stanton-Keir 1st, Venetoulis 2nd and Isherwood 3rd in the Snr 200m individual medley and Snr 100m freestyle events.

In the 12's division we saw an extremely close overall age champion race, with the consistent Cody Rixom finish just in front of Harrison Loeffler. Butterfly and backstroke were won by Loeffler with Rixom winning the breaststroke event. Rixom also finished 2nd in the butterfly event followed by Charlie Guthrie in 3rd. Alexander Costa streamed down the pool to take the 50m freestyle event as well as 3rd in the breaststroke. Loeffler also swam 2nd in 50m freestyle with Luca Di Cristo 3rd. Di Cristo also performed well in the backstroke with a fine 2nd placing. Bili Robertson showed he is not only a land based athlete with 2nd in the breaststroke. It was great to find time to hold all 4 relays for a splendid way to conclude the day of racing. Amazingly, all 4 age divisions were taken out by Williams House. In this awesome display of relay swimming, the defending champions asserted their authority to claim the 2016 House Champion title once more. Thank you to all the staff, parents and boys for their contribution in making the day a great success.
