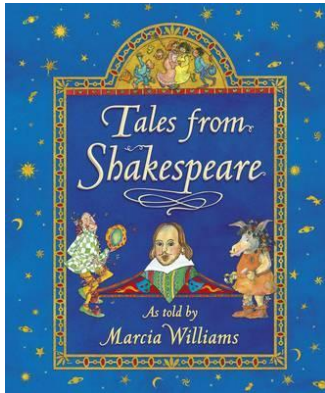

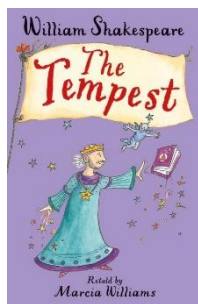

Tales from Shakespeare by Marcia Williams



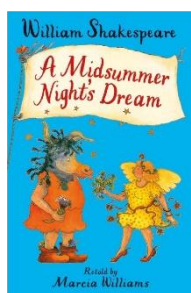

The Tempest by Marcia Williams



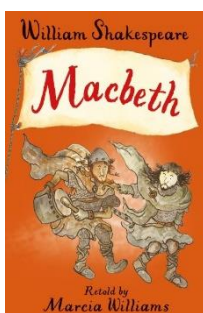
