NSW FUTSAL Championships

On Tuesday, 2 Wyvern FUTSAL teams travelled to Menai Sports Centre to compete in the NSW knockout tournament. Both teams had trained well and were hoping to reach the final to secure a place in the next round of the State Futsal Championships.

During the first matches the Newington White team were the first to play and got off to steady start, conceding 2 goals and scoring 2 of their own to take a draw against Amity College. The Black team played Inaburra Gold and came away with a resounding 6 – 0 victory resulting from some great teamwork and finishing prowess.

The White team earned 2 hard fought victories in their next matches against The Illawarra Grammar School and the International Football School, both with a score-line of 2 -1. These tight games demonstrated the composure and determination the White team possessed. These attributes would prove valuable later in the day. The team then progressed to the semi-finals with a big win over Inaburra Silver in the final pool match.

Wyvern Black team had trouble finishing off their pressure during the next 3 pool matches. The boys never stopped trying and showed a super resilience and team spirit despite their frustration. Losses to Mount Sinai, Oatley Public and St Spiridon meant the White team would miss out on semi-final action, but could now focus their support for the White team.

The semi-final saw Wyvern White reacquaint themselves with Amity College who contested the 2 all draw in round 1. This semi-final game with higher stakes at play, would evolve into one of the games of the tournament. Too and fro went the scoring of spectacular FUTSAL goals. Evidently both teams had improved their standard of play from the first game, creating a wonderful spectacle for nervous supporters. Fulltime sounded with the scores locked once more at 4 all. 3 minutes of "Golden Goal" extra time could not determine a winner, so on we went to the penalty shootout. Parents and boys alike struggled to maintain their composure during the epic pressure. In goals, Daniel Maxwell perhaps had to endure the most working feverishly to repel balls from the net. Once more the teams could not be separated after the penalty shootout, so on the gladiators pushed to sudden death penalties.

The clear tension on the Wyvern White bench and supporters did not translate to the Wyvern penalty taker, with the successful attempts continuing. Cheers went up and celebrations erupted when Wyvern eventually won through to the final with an errant kick from Amity. The boys were quick to show grace and humility, consoling the disappointed Amity team with a respectful show of sportsmanship.

In the grand-final match Wyvern played a strong Illawarra Grammar School team for the major prize. Once again the boys displayed great tenacity and grit to stay in the match after conceding an early goal. Unfortunately the boys could not maintain their resolve after such an emotional semi and were beaten into 2nd place.

Both teams had a terrific day and every player left with the knowledge that they improved as players. Fortunately our White team will progress to compete at the State Futsal Championships on Tuesday 2nd August. Special thanks go to the supporters and parents for their good hearted efforts.
