Attention - Winter Sport Punctuality:

If your son suddenly becomes unavailable for a match due to unforeseen circumstances on a Friday night/Saturday morning, it is expected that you contact your son's coach as early as possible. Absence from sport is the same as absence from any school activity and it is expected that your son brings a letter explaining his absence when he first returns to school. This letter should be addressed to the coach and a copy sent to the Wyvern Sportsmaster (Mr Joel Wilson). Finally, we ask that all boys be:

- Ensure that correct Newington sports uniform is worn (this includes playing equipment and safety equipment).

NSW FUTSAL Championships

Wyvern entered 2 strong teams in the NSW School FUTSAL Championships this year, with the boys travelling to Menai for the Sutherland Region gala day. Wyvern White team took to the court first meeting Laguna Street Green. From the outset our Wyvern team pressured the opponents goal making several worthwhile shots on goal to no avail. However, the pressure did not subside at all until the Laguna Street defence finally succumbed to a piece of brilliance from Jahn Knoph just before the break. Mr Pollard's expert halftime appraisal had an obvious impact with the team finally showing their finishing prowess to send 5 more goals into the back of the net from Seb Webber, Roman Lewis and more from Jahn Knoph. The White team ran out convincing 6-0 winners in a fine first up performance.

Buoyed by the excellent game from their counterparts, Wyvern Black team prepared for their first match against St Spyridon College. Immediately the match started at a furious pace with the teams working overtime to gain the ascendancy. St Spyridon were undoubtedly an extremely tough opponent showing skill and pace to lead 2-0 at the half. With the game in St Spyridon's favour, Wyvern Black mounted a courageous comeback with 2 goals in quick succession. The momentum was definitely with Wyvern, but it was quickly taken back with 3 late goals to St Spyridon in an intense, super high-quality game. Judging by the standard, it was expected that Wyvern Black and St Spyridon may meet again later in the day during the finals stage of the event.

The White team continued on their winning way with comfortable games against Laguna Street Purple and Emanuel Blue. With 3 wins from as many games the White team progressed to the Quarter Final stage of the event full of confidence. James Rodgers was providing good opportunities to score; Roman Lewis was great in transition with tireless effort and Peter Koumoulas thwarted many an attacking raid with expert defending.

Wyvern Black also progressed to the Quarter Finals with relatively easy victories from their remaining pool games against Laguna Street Red, Mount Sinai Red and Laguna Street Orange. Luka Wong and Will Beattie offered poise and skill to pick apart defences, while Frankie Alafaci was stoic in goals when pressured. Arlo Merewether provided a solid wall at the back with an unflappable demeanour, and Oscar McLeod delivered with his thunderbolt left boot.

The Quarter Final draw was announced, and an uneasy feeling crept over the Wyvern players and supporters alike. Black would play White in a battle for the ages, with mate against mate in a winner take all pathway to the Semi Finals. Before the match began, Mr Pollard's Black team were favoured to win, mainly due to the form they had displayed during the pool matches earlier. Mr Wilson's White team were underdogs, but certainly embraced the opportunity to match up against their more fancied rivals, fighting tooth and nail. This game was a great display of Wyvern depth as neither team gave an inch, tackling, chasing and competing their way to a standstill before the break. A halftime score of nil all certainly described the battle well, with parents and coaches shifting restlessly in seats, cheering on their team whilst trying not to impede the efforts of fellow Wyvern players on the opposing side.



With a sharp shot the White team took a 1-0 lead and instantly more belief entered their psyche. Ramsey Safieh did not stop working hard, only outshone by Toby Torrible and his decisive efforts to repel countless attacking opportunities in goals. With the game drawing ever closer to an upset for the White team, a leveller was scored by the Black team after classy play from Taliesin Dorigo. At 1-1 and a minute to play the game was absolutely for the taking. The White team pressed hard late and nearly came up with the match winner only to be halted by tenacious defence from Black. In a lightning fast transition, the Black team were presented with one last chance which they took with precise finishing skill. The whistle blew, and half of our boys rejoiced whilst the other half were momentarily upset at coming so close. Mr Pollard addressed all of the boys explaining how proud we were of the way every boy played the match. It was definitely an exhibition of everything we strive for in Wyvern Sport. Wyvern Spirit attributes of fair play, respect, "never give in" attitude, enjoyment and courage were all absolutely evident in a tremendous match from both teams.

With the win the Black team progressed to the Semi Final stage where they continued on with a close, but sound 2-1 victory over Emanuel Red. Arlo Merewether peppered the framework of the goals during the Semi, before we were reunited with St Spyridon in the Grand Final of the day. In another tremendously skilful match, both teams provided a classy spectacle for all to enjoy. Wyvern Black fought hard for a win, but St Spyridon prevailed once more for a tight 4-1 victory. As runners-up the Wyvern Black team learned a lot about the nature of sport and improved their teamwork and feel for the fastpaced format of the game. As runners up, the boys' efforts were rewarded with a spot in the State Championships to be held in Term 3 at the Penrith Sports Stadium. I am sure the boys cannot wait for another opportunity to compete.
