Trinity Invitational Swimming Carnival

The Wyvern swim team competed at the Trinity Invitational Swimming Carnival last week hoping to finish off 2018 with a few more PB's. The carnival is an opportunity to compare your progress over the last 6 months against others from your school as well as rival schools.

Angus Baker Wood and Lewis Saupin were up first in the individual medley events. Both swam solid races in 5th and 2nd respectively, providing a confident start to the program.

Newington's youngest competitors were at the carnival, with most representatives from the 8 years age group competing at an inter-school carnival for the first time. Nicholas Softsis 3rd, Noah Zoud 3rd, Mateja Wong 3rd and Digby Leadon 3rd swam their hearts out in the 25m freestyle. Digby 2nd, Mateja 3rd and backed up this performance in the 25m breaststroke race. Digby 4th and Nicholas 5th then finished with super efforts in the breaststroke, before the boys came together for a 3rd place finish in the 4 x 25m relay event.

The 9 year age group started their freestyle with Lionel Falk Brown 5th, Angus Baker Wood 3rd, Alex Nicholias 4th and Aleksander Barlin 4th. Aleksander swam in every stroke, with 4th in backstroke and breaststroke and 2nd in butterfly, as well as medley relays and freestyle relays, with excellent performances. Alex won his backstroke event nicely

and Angus finished 3rd and 4th in the butterfly and breaststroke with fine displays. The U/9 4 x 50m freestyle relay was an even race with our boys in 4th.

The 10 year age group was spearheaded by James Hoskins, who competed in the 50m and 100m freestyle, breaststroke and backstroke, 10 years freestyle relay as well as the junior medley relay. Peter Farah, Charlie Appleyard and Harrison Veitch joined the 10 years contingent swimming solidly throughout the carnival. The 10 year relay finished 5th with Hoskins, Appleyard, Veitch and Farah giving their best.

Sam Chittendon, Orlando Mina, Joel Zipeure and Liam West started well in the 11 years 50m freestyle races. Cameron Wilk Ellis swam breaststroke 5th and the medley relay within this group, showing his improvement in the pool. Liam swam backstroke 7th, butterfly 4th, 100m freestyle 3rd and 6th in the senior medley relay. Orlando swam in the butterfly 3rd and breaststroke 6th, with Joel finishing 5th in the backstroke. Sam, Liam, Joel and Orlando reunited to finish 5th in the freestyle relay with a competitive performance.

Wyvern's 12 year olds took to the water with Toby Torrible 1st, Anthony Bordina 2nd, Charlie Roberts 4th and Lewis Saupin 3rd in the 50m freestyle. Arlo Merewether joined the group for the breaststroke and also filled in for backstroke with commendable attitude. Arlo finished his program as part of the senior medley relay. Toby Torrible was in super form, showing vast improvement from earlier in the season. Toby finished 2nd in the butterfly to go with his earlier win. Swimming captain Lewis Saupin enjoyed his big program finishing 5th in breaststroke and butterfly, 4th in backstroke and 3rd in 100m freestyle. Toby, Anthony, Charlie and Lewis capped off a big day with a fine performance to finish 2nd in the freestyle relay.

Trinity's carnival was the last swimming carnival of the year. A year where Wyvern's swim team enjoyed a great deal of success, with many individual performances of note.
