Tony Azevedo was the former captain of the US National Men's Water Polo Team who in 2008 were Olympic silver medallists'. Tony is a five-time Olympian (2000, 2004, 2008, 2012, 2016), and considered to be one of the best American water polo players in recent history. #### <u>Newington Preparatory Schools' Inter-House Biathlon</u> <u>Championships Report</u>

The competitors had assembled for the annual Inter-House Biathlon held at Newington senior school. The event is open to boys from Y3-6, who swim 400m and run 1600m around the lush Stanmore grounds.

The Y6 boys were first to take to the pool, setting off in 5second intervals, before churning up and down the pool. After a fast swim leg, the boys made their way to the allimportant transition, with Connor Mosely leading the way. Hugo Isherwood was enjoying a good race as was Harry Halleen and Felix Lee. Sam Walker, Henry Lapham, Harry Keeping and Oliver Senior pushed themselves to the limit and made up ground. At the conclusion, Connor Mosely could not be matched in the U/12 race winning in a fast time.
