National Quality Standard Area 2: Children's Health and Safety

How do the features of the physical environment of your service ensure that younger children are safe, while older children are provided with appropriate levels of challenge?

We tend to challenge the boys' mind with puzzles, brain teasers and problem-solving activities. Rio and Caspar love to physically challenge the boys and build upon their gross motor skills during sports games and will match the level of difficulty to the age group participating.

How might you improve on this?

If we planned more obstacle-based activities this would challenge the younger boys and engage with their risk assessing skills.

How are the children supported to develop a sense of care and respect for the physical environment and the resources available to them?

Our space on the rooftop is excellent, it means we can still enjoy an outdoor environment, while also being sheltered from sun and rain. However, we do lack some greenery and the presence of the natural environment. This is something we have considered from the beginning of the year and we're excited to announce that COSH will be running a 'Gardening/STEM' Club in Term 4. During these sessions we will be able to promote the importance of sustainable practices like gardening and waste management.

Child Safe Standard One: Child safety is embedded in organisational leadership, governance, and culture.

How do leaders ensure we have effective child safe risk management

We embed effective child safe risk management strategies by creating comprehensive policies, service philosophies and developing a culture which puts children's safety and welfare at the forefront of our cause. We invest in educators who genuinely care about the children in their care and take time to really get to know each individual child.

Child Safe Standard Two: Children participate in decisions affecting them and are taken seriously

What opportunities do we offer children so they can give their views? We believe that giving children a say in decisions that affect them gives them a sense of responsibility and initiative. We are often asking the boys to give us feedback about menu selection and Educational Program and take their opinions and ideas very seriously. Every fortnight we put three questions on our reflectional journal, these questions are to be filled out by the boys throughout the week. We then file these suggestions and implement them where possible. We offer the older boys the chance to facilitate and run group games and experiences, which cements their role within the service and peer leaders.
