A Reconciliation Action Plan program provides a framework for organizations to support the national reconciliation movement. Throughout this week, we've been having formal and informal chats to the boys about what Reconciliation means.

On Tuesday we held a group meeting with the boys. We asked the boys what does "Acknowledgment of Country" mean to them. Some responses from the boys;

"We say it at the beginning of assemblies to pay respect" - Charlie, Year 1

"We say it to thank the Indigenous people, past and present" - Owen, Year 4

"It is to acknowledge that Indigenous people lived here before we did" - Krishan, Year 5

I gave the boys the task of creating a visual Acknowledgement of Country that would tie into the values of Wyvern House. Hopefully next newsletter we have some examples from the boys to share!

CommunityOSH Reconcilliation Action Plan (RAP)

Our Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP) is a formal statement of commitment to reconciliation.



Reflect on our current level of cultural competence and provide staff with a range of opportunities to build and extend their knowledge and understanding of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures. Support staff to include cultural competence training as a professional learning opportunity within their formal accreditation processes. Celebrate National Reconciliation Week (NRW) from 27 May to 3 June each year.



Fly or display the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flag at our programs to demonstrate our pride and respect for the histories, cultures and contributions of Australia's First Peoples. Flying or displaying the flags promotes a sense of community partnership and a commitment toward reconciliation. Ensure that all staff, students and children are given the opportunity to learn about the meaning and history of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flags



Opportunities

Eensure policies are inclusive of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people and that the policies strive to increase knowledge of, and respect for, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander histories and cultures in Australia. Examine the NQF and NQS to identify where (in)direct reference to matters such as equality, equity, unity and inclusivity is made, and discuss how educators can build their capacity to ensure that corresponding Standards are being met.
